
Talking is not my thing by Rose Robbins.

Welcome to the first of our blog posts focusing on books which feature characters with specific diagnoses and /or additional needs.


First up is Talking is not my thing By Rose Robbins.



This is a simple picture book which focuses on the relationship between a young autistic girl and her brother. The book explains through the young girl's thoughts some of her experiences and how she uses non-verbal communication, such as PECS in her daily life.



The illustrations within the book are bright and colourful and the story is one which many of our siblings can relate to.



The story focuses on the acceptance of children, but also offers reassurance and explanations for some of those harder to understand traits and behaviours such as sensory overload and impulsive behaviours.



This would be a great book to share with siblings and other family members to bring them into the world of an ASC young person. A companion picture book *Me and my sister* is also available
